Lego Robotics/Green City Challenge 6/20 Mello Grades 4-8 12:30-4:30

Students will build and program Lego Mindstorms NXT robots. Students will engage in training activities and then put their building, programming, and problem-solving skills to work to create a robot that will solve challenges related to renewable energy. The several levels of the Green City Challenge will ensure that students of varying Lego experience can work at an appropriate difficulty level. Beginning Guitar Camp 6/20 Mackie-Jenkins Grades 5-8 8:30-12:30 \$160

Whitewater Canoe Camp Berg Grades 6-9 9-3:30 \$300

This summer we are offering a five-day whitewater canoeing school for beginner to intermediate paddlers in grades 6-9. Canoeing is a classic way to build confidence, develop judgment and teamwork. River running allows great access to unspoiled areas and the chance to learn about the natural history of our area. We will be canoeing on the South Fork of the Shenandoah River, a tributary of the Potomac River and the Chesapeake Bay. This is a beautiful river that flows between the Blue Ridge Mountains and Massanutten Mountain where ledges create rapids and chutes, providing an optimal place to learn whitewater technique.

The first three days begin at 9 and conclude at 3:30. Students should arrive at Highland, dressed for the river and with a bag lunch. The overnight section leaves Thursday, June 23 at 9am, and returns to the campus on Friday, June 24 at 6 pm. Students should bring all items on the equipment list in duffel bags and we will repack in dry bags for the river.

This course is approved by the state of Virginia. The classroom portion is one-half of the state's requirements to complete the driver education program. The second half of the state's requirement is behind the wheel training. This portion is separated into two areas: 40 hours of practice with parents and 14 lessons of in-car instruction with a certified instructor. Students and parents will receive additional information and registration forms for the second portion during the classroom session.

CERAMICS 1 Jones GRADES 9-11 1PM-4PM

FOUR WEEKS (June 20- July 22) \$600

EARN $\frac{1}{2}$ COURSE CREDIT

In this introductory course, students learn methods and techniques for working with clay to create art. They explore various hand building techniques, begin to work on the potter's wheel, and discover ways to bring the two methods together in a single work. Though they spend more time on the wheel, this course serves only as an introduction to wheel-throwing. Students leave the course with a basic knowledge of clay.

2D COMPUTER GRAPHICS Patry GRADES 9-11 8:30-12:30
THREE WEEKS (June 20- July 15) \$600
EARN $\frac{1}{2}$ COURSE CREDIT

Computer graphics are employed everywhere in our world today. In this course, students will learn the main topics of Adobe InDesign CS2, Adobe Illustrator CS2, and Adobe Photoshop CS2. Students will learn how to get started with InDesign, including how to work with text and set up a document, how to work with frames, and how to work with colors. Students will also learn how to get started with Illustrator, including how to create text and gradients, draw and compose an illustration, transform and distort objects, and how to work with layers. Additionally, students will learn how to get started with Photoshop, including how to work with layers, make selections, incorporate color techniques, and place type in an image. This class fulfills a .5 credit computer science elective requirement upon completing the 60 hours.

THE DUTCH KILLS THEATER CAMP GRADES 9-11 9 -noon
TWO WEEKS \$500

The Dutch Kills Theater in association with Highland school is offering a two week summer intensive course in theater. **Professional working actors from New York will teach courses** in Audition Technique, Voice, Shakespeare, Scene Study, Clown, Physical Theater, Juggling, Collaborative Theater and writing. There will also be a few smaller seminars on Theater Tech, Costuming and Set design. The Dutch Kills members have been trained in New York, London, Oxford and Paris and have degrees from Sarah Lawrence, The Jacques Lecoq School, and the British American Drama Academy.
